Birthday Cake


Forms are available from your child's room and at reception to order Birthday Cakes - 48 hours notice is required when ordering.

We look forward to more sunny days to enjoy outdoor play as much as we can












Playspace 2

What we have been doing the past 2 months:

This month we have been focusing our art and crafts based around recycled objects. The children have been getting creative with things such as used tissue boxes, out of date magazine clippings and anything from our lovely chef Adam that can be reused such as old lids. In addition to this our Centre has now created recycling station at our entrance for families to donate items we can use for our daily crafts. Setting up a recycling station in our facility will give your children the practice they need to educate them in this area. Use the center as a focal point for your recycling efforts.

This month we have introduced a vet into play space 2. This is an extension based on our original Doctors permanent experience in the room where the children role played taking care of their babies, taking temperatures, feeding, checking their heart beat with our stethoscope and giving medicines. The children have been reading a lot of stories in group time relating to animals and due to this huge interest in this area educators decided to create a Veterinary clinic for the children to use their imagination and create their own role play. We are hearing lots of animal noises coming from our clinic and the children have created wonderful role plays such as bandaging their sore animal and giving medicine. Dramatic play is s a

type of *play* where *children* assign and accept *roles* and act them out. It's pretending to be. Sometimes *children* take on real-world *roles*, other times they take on fantasy *roles*. This Is such a wonderful learning experience to watch and be involved in.



Warmer weather Yay! We are so excited for spring to begin and coming up this month we have a lot of spring based art experiences and sensory activities ready to go. The children will be spending

a lot more of their time outdoors as well as Meal times happening out in the lovely weather.

The children also took part in a listening game, where they were sat with by an educator in a small group and given a series of instructions along with a work sheet the complete tasks on for example 'color in the chicken, put a line on the cow' this was a really great listen game for the children and they were all very eager to participate.

We have a visit from Braveheart's this month where the children were educated on personal safety and what to



Playspace 4 - 4 year old Kinder Program

The past couple of months have been a very busy time within the kindergarten program. Much of the program has been focused on the children's interests which engages and excites all involved. Children

have been learning about the human body and healthy eating, with activities such as cutting out pictures and creating their own healthy lunchbox and looking at the 5 senses of the body. Furthermore, children thoroughly enjoyed being involved in the physical activities such as running races and obstacle courses that were set up last month.

Living Eggs, the chicken hatching program was a very enjoyable experience for all involved and the children loved learning about the life cycle of a chicken and how to care for them. In addition, we had Bravehearts come and visit us. Bravehearts are a company that teaches young children about what to do if they feel unsafe, and who they can turn to. Ditto the Bear was very funny and made the show come alive.

Throughout our room, children are becoming more actively involved in their learning and given the opportunity for choice as much as possible. On a daily basis, children have the choice if they would like to go upstairs for the morning. This allows smaller











group activities and more hands on and intentional teaching to occur. When the actual program starts at 10am each day, our first group time occurs. This involves 'Welcome to Country' which is an experience the children really seem to enjoy. Children are beginning to learn about the Aboriginals and how they used to live. The book titled 'Welcome to Country' is read and it is wonderful to see children remembering the words, and reading aloud with the educator. The projector is then set up with a traditional dance, whereby children have the opportunity to use the clapsticks they painted and get up and dance to the music. The focus board is also done in this time which changes on a weekly basis. This entails the alphabet, numbers, sight words, our French word and the daily chart. We look forward to finishing off the term and getting ready for Term 4, with the main focus being that the children will be ready for school.





A word from our chef....Adam Peterson

With spring around the corner I thought it was a great time to encourage everyone to bring to our attention any changes to a child's allergy, intolerance or cultural preference information. Please feel free to email the centre or discuss with your child's room leader any new information you may have or to review that the information we have is current. Keeping us up to date with any new information helps ensure that we are providing the children with the best variety of meals available and that dietary requirements are being meet. Thank you for your assistance and bring on the sunshine!

I thought I would share our carrot cakes recipes which has become a favourite of the children's. If you skip the icing and lower the amount of sugar it can be quite a bit healthier.

Self-Rising Flour 2.5 cups

Brown Sugar .5 cup

Cinnamon 1 tsp.

Eggs 2 each

Vanilla 1 tsp.

Oil 50 ml

Milk 200 ml

Golden Syrup 1 Tbsp.

Carrot 1 medium size

Method:

- Pre heat oven to 150° C
- 2. Finely grate Carrot
- 3. Mix Dry ingredients
- 4. Combine all ingredients
- Spay Oil and line with Baking Paper a 20cm x 20 cm Pan. Fill with cake Mix
- 6. Bake for 45 min to one hour or until you can stick a tooth pick in the middle and it comes out clean.
